

IN-PERSON CONTEST SCRIPTS

(EVALUATION, TABLE TOPICS AND INTERNATIONAL SPEECH CONTESTS)

Use the appropriate script(s) from Sections 1, 2, and 3 below for your contests. Use Section 4 (Presenting Awards), if applicable, after completing the (last) contest and before announcing contest winners.

Winners in each speech contest should only be announced at the end of the contest (Section 5).

(Note: The words "Distinguished Toastmaster" should be used instead of "DTM" to refer to anyone who has earned the designation.)

1. Evaluation Contest Script

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS (SAA)

One minute before the start:

SAA #1: Ladies AND Gentlemen, the Evaluation contest officially begins in one minute. *(Repeat.)*

At the contest start time:

SAA #1: Good evening, fellow Toastmasters and welcome guests! I am **?????**, the Sergeant at Arms of this Contest. This event is now called to order. Please silence your electronic devices and help me welcome our Contest Master, **(Distinguished) Toastmaster ????????**.

CONTEST MASTER (CM)

CM: Good **evening**, Fellow Toastmasters and most welcome guests! Welcome to the Evaluation Contest for **(??????Club/Area/Division)**. I am honored to serve as your Contest Master. At this time, please help me acknowledge the Dignitaries in the room. *(Acknowledge any Trio/DEC members, District leaders and other dignitaries, using their proper titles.)*

The purpose of the Evaluation Contest is to provide an opportunity to learn by observing the more proficient speakers who have benefited from their Toastmasters training, and to recognize the best as an encouragement to all.

Please welcome our Chief Judge, **(Distinguished) Toastmaster ??????**, to provide a brief overview of the rules of the Evaluation Contest.

CHIEF JUDGE

CJ: Thank you, Contest Master [?????]. The Evaluation Contest follows all rules outlined in the General Rules section of the current Toastmasters International Speech Contest Rulebook.

- It has been confirmed that all contestants are eligible and have been briefed. All judges have been briefed and are qualified to judge this contest.
- Contestants will be sequestered before presenting but may stay in the contest room after their evaluation.
- The Sergeant-At-Arms is instructed to allow no one in or out of the room once the contest has begun, until the last Contestant has spoken.
- Protests and Disqualifications
 - ✓ Protests are limited to eligibility and must only be lodged by voting judges and/or Contestants. Any protest must be lodged with the Chief Judge and/or Contest Chair prior to the contest being adjourned. The Chief Judge, Contest Chair, Voting Judges and Contestants must not consider protests from audience members.
 - ✓ The Contest Chair can disqualify a Contestant on the basis of eligibility.
 - ✓ All decisions of the Voting Judges and Qualifying Judges are final.
- When introducing a Contestant, the Contest Master will give the Contestant Name twice, which will be the Contestant's signal to begin.
- The time of the evaluations is two to three minutes. **Any Contestant speaking less than one minute and thirty seconds or more than three minutes and thirty seconds will be disqualified.** The timing cards will be shown as follows.
- Timer, please show the timing cards as I give the sequence:
 - ✓ **Green** at two minutes
 - ✓ **Yellow** at two minutes and thirty seconds.
 - ✓ **Red** at three minutes. This will stay up until the contestant has finished speaking. No notice shall be given should a contestant go overtime.
- Timing starts with the first word uttered or when the contestant uses any form of verbal or non-verbal communication with the audience.
- There will be one minute of silence between contestants while the judges complete their ballots.
- Contestants will listen to a test speech and will then be escorted to a separate waiting room. Once their number is called, they will have one minute to return to the contest room and be acknowledged by the Contest Master.

Contest Master, let the contest begin!

CONTEST MASTER

CM: Thank you, Chief Judge [????]. The contestants have drawn their speaking positions. The speaking order is:

At the end of the five minutes, the Sergeant-At-Arms will collect everyone's notes except those of the first Contestant, and will escort the first Contestant back into the contest room. At the conclusion of each Contestant's presentation, there will be one minute of silence for the judges to mark their ballots, during which the next Contestant will be sent to the contest room.

CM: We will now have silence while the judges finalize their ballots. I will announce once the Chief Judge has left the room.

Judges, at this time, please complete your ranking of the Contestants. Print your name and sign the bottom of your ballot. Make sure you have ONE NAME for the First, Second and Third Place and give your ballot to the Ballot Counters as instructed in the Judge's briefing.

Ballot Counters, please remain in this room until you have received all the ballots assigned to you, then exit to the Chief Judge's room.

Timers, please give your timing sheets to the Chief Judge as instructed during your briefing.

(Confirm ballot counters and the Chief Judge have left the room before continuing)

CM: Thank you. Let's give the contestants a big round of applause!

(While waiting for the votes to be counted, interview Contestants unless anyone is in the next contest. In that case, do a Table Topics session with the audience avoid calling on any functionaries. Resume contest when the Chief Judge has returned to the contest room.)

CM: The Chief Judge is back in the room. Once again, let us congratulate all our Contestants today. We will announce the winners at the end of the last contest.

The Table Topics Contest will begin after a five-minute intermission. Timer, please hold up the red card at the end of the five minutes, and alert the Sergeant-At-Arms.

The Table Topics Contest follows all the rules outlined in the General Rules section of the current Speech Contest Rulebook.

- It has been confirmed that all Contestants are eligible and have been briefed. All judges have been briefed and are confirmed to be qualified and eligible to judge this contest.
- The Sergeant-At-Arms is instructed to allow no one in or out of the room once the contest has begun, until the last Contestant has spoken.
- All Contestants shall receive the same topic, which shall be of a general nature. The topic is selected by the Contest Chair or designee. Contestants will receive no advance knowledge of the topic until the moment they are introduced by the Contest Master.
- Contestants may not use digital or other devices during the contest to gain an unfair advantage.
- When the contest begins, all Contestants except the first contestant shall be escorted to a waiting room by the Sergeant-at-Arms, and will remain there until it is their turn to speak.
- The Contest Master will introduce each Contestant by announcing their name, the topic, the topic again and the Contestant's name again. This will be the Contestant's signal to begin.
- There will be one minute of silence between Contestants while the judges complete their ballots, and the next contestant returns to the room.
- All speeches delivered by Contestants must conform to the timing guidelines for the contest. The time for the speeches is one to two minutes. **Any Contestant speaking for less than one minute or more than two minutes and thirty seconds will be disqualified.**
- Timer, please show the timing cards as I give the sequence:

- ✓ **Green** at one minute
 - ✓ **Yellow** at one minute and thirty seconds.
 - ✓ **Red** at two minutes. This will stay up until the contestant has finished speaking. No notice shall be given should a contestant go overtime.
- Timing starts with the first word uttered or when the Contestant uses any form of verbal or non-verbal communication with the audience.

(Confirm Ballot Counters and the Chief Judge have left the room before continuing.)

(Interview the Contestants until the Chief Judge has returned to the Contest Room)(Skip interviews if contestants are in more than one contest.) (Opportunity to call on a Dignitary to address the audience)

CM: The Chief Judge is back in the Room.

- It has been confirmed that all contestants are eligible and have been briefed. All judges have been briefed and are qualified to judge this contest.
- Contestants may remain in the contest room throughout the contest.
- The Sergeant-At-Arms is instructed to allow no one in or out of the room once the contest has begun, until the last Contestant has spoken.
- Protests and Disqualifications
 - ✓ Twenty-five percent or less of the speech may be devoted to quoting, paraphrasing or referencing another person's content. Any quoted, paraphrased or referenced content must be identified during the speech presentation. Contestants who reference another contestant's speech or another speech contestant will be disqualified.

- ✓ Protests are limited to eligibility, originality and reference to another Contestant or another Contestant's speech and must only be lodged by voting judges and/or Contestants. Any protest must be lodged with the Chief Judge and/or Contest Chair prior to the contest being adjourned. The Chief Judge, Contest Chair, Voting Judges and Contestants must not consider protests from audience members.
- ✓ Before a Contestant can be disqualified on the basis of originality, or for referencing another contestant's speech, the Contestant must be given an opportunity to respond to the Voting Judges. A majority of the Voting Judges must concur in the decision to disqualify.
- ✓ The Contest Chair can disqualify a Contestant on the basis of eligibility.
- ✓ All decisions of the Voting Judges and Qualifying Judges are final.
- When introducing a Contestant, the Contest Master will give the Contestant name, speech title, speech title again and their name again. This will be the Contestant's signal to begin.
- The time of the speeches is five to seven minutes. **Any Contestant speaking less than four minutes and thirty seconds or more than seven minutes and thirty seconds will be disqualified.** The timing cards will be shown as follows.
- Timer, please show the timing cards as I give the sequence:
 - ✓ **Green** at five minutes.
 - ✓ **Yellow** at six minutes.
 - ✓ **Red** at seven minutes. This will stay up until the contestant has finished speaking. No notice shall be given should a contestant go overtime.
- Timing starts with the first word uttered or when the contestant uses any form of verbal or non-verbal communication with the audience.
- There will be one minute of silence between contestants while the judges complete their ballots.
- Contest Master, let the contest begin!

(Confirm ballot counters and the Chief Judge have left the room)
